The American Band College

Now in its sixteenth year of operation, the American Band College began as a summer workshop for school band directors. In 1992 a masters degree program was implemented in which three candidates enrolled. Today, there are nearly 250 band directors from more than 40 states and Greece enrolled in the masters program. This summer nearly 50 will complete the degree requirements bringing the total number of graduates in the first eleven classes to 250.

The teaching staff for ABC includes 28 of the world's finest teachers, conductors, and composers. Each summer a new faculty is presented so that attendees are exposed to the expertise of more than 60 teachers during their 3 summers in Ashland. Local faculty include Scott McKee (Managing Director), Max McKee (ABC Executive Director), Larry Hudson (Director of Operations) and Cynthia Hutton (SOU Director of Bands). ABC Graduates on the staff include Paul Kassulke (Minnesota 1994), Cathi Leibinger (Florida 1999), Ted Burton (Oregon 2000), Elizabeth Lonergan (Oregon 2002), Jay Jones (California 1998), Matthew Arau (Colorado 2003) and Marianne Robison (Oregon 1997). Nel McKee (Financial Manager) and additional operations staff include Danielle Miller (University of Oregon), Angel McDonald (ABC Center for Research), plus Nelson and Cathy Hickling (Ashland).

When candidates first enter the program (75 new ones this year alone), the American Band College faculty administers an extensive entrance exam measuring 40 areas of teaching (instrument fingerings, embouchure development, percussion instruments and techniques, conducting, band literature and many others). From those results each of the candidates develops a course of study that concentrates only on his or her 8 to 15 areas of weakness. This includes annual exams and the creation of special thesis projects in those areas.

During their on-campus time each summer, candidates attend more than 70 sessions covering many facets of band directing while playing 3 hours a day in the ABC Directors' Band. In this ensemble, candidates sightread more than 75 new compositions and also prepare 35 compositions for the two major public performances under eight guest conductors and two world-renowned soloists. This year over 100 second and third year masters candidates served as preparation conductors for the guest composers and directors, as part of the American Band College evaluation process at Southern Oregon University.

Guest conductors for this year's Ginger Rogers Craterian Theater concert include Toshio Akiyama (retired conductor of the Sony Concert Band in Japan), Pierre Kuijpers (retired conductor of the Royal Military Band in Holland), Mike Bankhead (retired conductor/commander of the United States Air Force Band, Washington, DC), and M. Max McKee (retired Director of Bands, Southern Oregon University). The Capitol Quartet (Baltimore, Maryland) appear as guest soloists with each of the American Band College Directors' Bands.

The ABC Directors' Band also participates in the Ashland Fourth of July parade and then presents a two-and-a-half hour Fireworks Concert at Ashland High Football Stadium beginning at 8:00 p.m. Guest conductors for this year's July 4th concert include American composers, Robert W. Smith and James Barnes plus Cynthia Hutton (Director of Bands, Southern Oregon University) and Tim Lautzenheiser (ABC Board of Directors/Master of Ceremonies). Guest artists will be Dos Amigos, tuba virtuosos, Patrick Sheridan and Sam Pilafian.
